Cork 2005 – Exhibition of Stamp Artwork

To commemorate Cork's tenure as European Capital of Culture, An Post issued two 48c stamps on 7 March 2005. The stamps depict a condensed panoramic view of famous Cork buildings and landmarks on both sides of the City's St. Patrick's Bridge.

An Post's celebration of Cork 2005 continues at the recently refurbished GPO in Oliver Plunkett Street, Cork, with an exhibition of artwork for stamps featuring people and places with particular relevance to Cork history, culture, politics and sport. Artwork featured includes Michael Collins, Frank O'Connor, Christy Ring, Roy Keane, the Fastnet Lighthouse and Garinish Island. The exhibition will continue until the end of May.

What is EUROPA?

EUROPA stamps are special stamps issued by European postal administrations under the aegis of PostEurop and have Europe as their central theme.

Each year more than 58 countries issue a Europa stamp and it is always interesting to see how various countries interpret the same topic in very different ways.

This year's theme is Gastronomy: the art of selecting, preparing, serving and enjoying fine food. The theme for next year will be 'Integration' as seen by young people.

Europa stamps are intended to underline cooperation in the postal domain - particularly with regard to philately - and they make a positive contribution to raising public awareness of the common roots, culture and history of Europe.

The Stamps

Two stamps will be issued by An Post on 9 May, 2005. Designed by Dialogue, the stamps feature original photography by Mike O'Toole, depicting the very best of Irish produce, drawn from land and sea and presented in a contemporary style.

EUROPA-GASTRONOMY

Prepared by multi-award winning chef Ross Lewis of ‘Chapter One’ Restaurant in Dublin, the stamps feature the constituent ingredients of traditional Irish Stew, including lamb, cabbage, carrots and potatoes (48c) and fresh oysters served on a bed of ice (65c).

The stamps are produced in specially designed 10 stamp sheetlets. The First Day Cover also features a photograph by Mike O’Toole depicting a selection of Irish farmhouse cheeses.

Gastronomy in Ireland

In the past, Ireland would not have been internationally renowned for its gastronomy. In fact, the introduction of the potato in the 17th century could be considered by some gastronomists to be the greatest occurrence or the worse calamity to befall the Irish diet and cuisine.

But today, Ireland is a thriving country with a population who demand cuisine that is on a par with the very best the world has to offer. It’s not surprising, then, that new Irish chefs are an exciting young breed changing the face of Irish gastronomy. And they have fantastic tools to work with: Ireland has an abundance of amazing raw materials including fresh produce from the fields, spectacular lamb and beef from pastures and sparkling seafood and shellfish from the ocean and rivers.

While Dublin undoubtedly has a thriving gastronomic scene, other towns can perhaps lay equal claim to being at the forefront of gastronomy in Ireland. Kinsale, for instance, is renowned for its restaurants. This small sheltered port boasts its own wine museum and a staggering 35 restaurants for its 2,000-odd population.

In a nut-shell, it is safe to say that Ireland has come a long way from the humble potato. In fact, Ireland now has restaurants and chefs that can satisfy the most demanding taste buds in the world.

As part of An Post's Fauna and Flora series in association with the WWF - World Wildlife Fund for Nature - we are delighted to present a series of stunning new stamps depicting four butterflies common to Ireland.



Butterflies are in the order of insects called Lepidoptera. They are most famous for their four wings that are usually covered by coloured scales, but also have a head, thorax, abdomen, two antennae, six legs and a coiled proboscis for drinking liquids such as flower nectar.

There are more than 20,000 different kinds of butterflies in the world. The majority are found in tropical environments, and butterflies are important as plant pollinators and as food for other animals (birds, mammals, spiders and other insects).

The four butterflies featured here are part of the 28 known resident species in Ireland. The design of the stamps has been specially developed to emphasize the spectacular colouring on the wings of the chosen butterflies.

To complement these beautiful stamps a full range of associated products is also available. The stamps can be purchased individually, as a set or on a First Day Cover. Also available is a minisheet featuring the Painted Lady butterfly and a First Day Cover with minisheet.

FAUNA & FLORA - BUTTERFLIES

The Butterflies

Small Copper (Lycaena phaeas)

Of all the Copper family, the Small Copper is the only one found in Ireland. With shiny copper wings with black dashes, it is usually found in meadows throughout Ireland from June to September.



Green Hairstreak (Callophrys rubi)

The most common of the three members of the Hairstreak family, it can be found in the boggy regions of Kildare and Kerry in May and June. The upperside is brown and it has a very attractive metallic green underside, although at rest the butterfly always keeps its wings closed.

Painted Lady (Cynthia cardui)

Found in Eastern and Southern coastal areas between June and September, this butterfly is a dull orange with black markings and a colourful red, black and white underside.

Pearl Bordered Fritillary (Boloria euphrosyne)

Smaller than other fritillaries, this butterfly is a brighter orange with a yellow underside. It is found in the Burren area in May and June.

FAUNA & FLORA - BUTTERFLIES



Did You Know...?

- A collective name for a group of butterflies is a Kaleidoscope.
- Butterflies communicate with each other by colour, chemicals, sound and physical actions.
- Adult butterflies can see all the colours we see, plus ultraviolet – a colour present in daisies, just outside the yellow centre.
- Butterflies live for an average of between 2 and 14 days, although some species live up to 11 months.
- When a butterfly lands on a plant, it can instantly 'taste' with its feet whether it is the kind of plant it is looking for.
- While caterpillars feed mainly on plant parts, adult butterflies 'eat' liquids to maintain their water balance and energy stores.

MY COLLECTION

Eminent Collector Geoffrey McAuley on his philatelic interests.

Stamps with a story behind them are my favourites. That's why I started collecting 'Czechoslovakia', a place which brings drama, heroism and tragedy to every page of one's album. With so many stories it is hard to know what to select. However, I've chosen the subject of the Czechoslovak Legion in Russia during and after the First World War.

When the war started, many Czech expatriates living in Russia joined the Russian army and were formed into the Druzina, the first unit of what was to be a potent force in winning independence for their country. Fig 1 shows the consecration of the flag of the first regiment at Kiev.

After Russia made peace with Germany in 1917, it was decided that the Legion would be transported across Siberia by train and taken by ship to France. The Legion which now numbered almost 70,000 men was scattered in hundreds of trains from the Ukraine to western Siberia. Living in cattle trucks they had no base, no weapons and no replacements and soon found themselves at loggerheads with local communists.

During the war they had been able to send mail home using the Red Cross's prisoner-of-war service. After the war, however, the postal service quickly collapsed - so the Legion organised its own. They had 12 post offices (all but one in cattle trucks). Every second day one would set off from Irkutsk, travel west to the Ural mountains, then east to Vladivostok and back to Irkutsk, a journey of two weeks. Figs 2 - 6 show essays drawn by Legionaries for these stamps and figs 7 - 9 show the actual stamps themselves. Later on, stamps were produced in Prague. (See figs 10 and 11. Notice how the stamps are slightly different as two dies were used.)

For two years the Legion actually controlled all 3,000 miles of the Trans-Siberian railway, and indeed several books have been written on their exploits. This is only one of hundreds of stories that can be found on the stamps of 'Czechoslovakia'.

The Cutty Sark Tall Ships Race

The Tall Ships race typically attracts a fleet of 70-100 vessels from about 20 countries and of every size, from 30ft yachts to square rigged ships over 300ft long. It is held annually in European waters and consists of two racing legs of several hundred nautical miles and a 'cruise in company' between the legs.



This year, the race will start in Waterford, Ireland, with the festivities commencing on 6 July 2005. It will begin with up to 100 Tall Ships sailing down the Suir with the Irish sail training vessel Asgard II leading the Parade of Sail. On 9 July the Tall Ships will then set off on the first leg of the race; Waterford to Cherbourg. From Cherbourg the fleet will cruise together to Newcastle in the North of England, and on 28 July commence the second and final leg of the race across to Fredrikstad in Norway, finishing on 3 August.

Time in port is usually three or four days, during which the focus is on activities for the young trainee sailors and providing a festival atmosphere for the local community. It is a fantastic event as the race attracts some of the largest sailing ships in existence, including the Irish Tall Ship, Jeannie Johnston.

To mark this year's race An Post are issuing three elegant stamps denominated at 48c, 60c and 65c. Also available is a First Day Cover featuring all three stamps and a wonderfully designed Presentation Pack which includes the three stamps and the First Day Cover. Dunbrody

The 48c stamp features the Tall Ship 'Dunbrody'. Weighing in at a hefty 458 tonnes, the 'Dunbrody' is 176ft long with a sail area of 10,100 sq ft. The ship is in fact a reconstruction of the original 'Dunbrody', built in Quebec in 1845 by Thomas Hamilton Oliver, an Irish emigrant from Co. Derry. Though the 'Dunbrody' was primarily a cargo vessel, she was fitted out with bunks for passengers desperate to escape the harrowing conditions of the Irish famine in the late 1840s.

Tenacious

The Tall Ship 'Tenacious' graces the 60c stamp. The largest wooden Tall Ship in the world, 'Tenacious' was built between 1996 and 2000 specifically to allow physically disabled people to experience the thrill of sailing this type of vessel. The many cleverly designed features of 'Tenacious' allow disabled crew to work independently alongside their able-bodied shipmates. Indeed up to 50% of the voyage crew of 40 may be physically disabled - including up to 8 wheelchair users.

Eagle

Built in 1936, the 'Eagle' is a huge 295ft, three-masted Barque with a sail area of over 21,000 sq ft. The ship serves as a seagoing classroom for approximately 175 cadets and instructors from the U.S. Coast Guard Academy. Incredibly, to handle a sail area of this enormity there is over 5 miles of rope (or rigging) on board the 'Eagle'.

A PORTRAIT OF THE ARTIST



We talk to Vincent Killowry about art, life and stamps.

Vincent Killowry studied fine art, painting and print-making in Galway and graduated in 1986. Although he enjoys painting many subjects, including equestrian and portraits, he is best known for his paintings of transport subjects. His reputation has grown over the past 25 years for his attention to detail combined with mood and atmosphere in his paintings.

Vincent's paintings first came to the attention of An Post in 1997 and he was subsequently commissioned to design his first set of postage stamps - the Pioneers of Aviation which were issued in 1998. Since then, he has designed stamps commemorating aviation, motor sport, maritime and railway history.

Vincent's most recent project was to design a series of stamps to commemorate the 150th anniversary of the opening of a direct rail link between Dublin and Belfast. The history of the Dublin-Belfast railway is a vast one and it is difficult to do such a subject justice with just four stamp designs. After much deliberation it was agreed to feature two scenes from the steam era and two from the present day.



The first of the steam era designs features GNR V Class engine no. 85 Merlin arriving with an Enterprise train at Amiens St. Station in the early fifties. This engine is preserved and can be seen hauling steam specials for enthusiasts from Dublin to Belfast. "I was privileged during my research to travel on one such excursion in September 2004. I met many interesting and helpful enthusiasts who made my work very enjoyable," said Vincent.



The second stamp features the Boyne viaduct. Crossing the viaduct is a northbound train being hauled by Qs class engine No.131 which is also preserved. "My thanks to Iarnrod Eireann for giving me full line-side access to the viaduct and Drogheda Station during the research phase and for their hospitality."



The third stamp features the modern Belfast Central Station with an Enterprise train poised ready for departure to Dublin. "The manager of Belfast Central NIR very kindly gave me a walking tour of the station and its environs. When I looked back at the station from the south end of the platform I noticed the skyline was dominated by the H & W shipyard cranes. This unmistakable landmark gave me the inspiration for the design."



The fourth design features the modern Enterprise passing through the countryside. "I simply wanted to convey the feeling of movement in this design."

The Man and the Coin

2005 has been designated the UNESCO World Year of Physics and in Ireland this year has been designated Hamilton Year 2005, Celebrating Irish Science.

This coin celebrates the life of Sir William Rowan Hamilton, Ireland's greatest mathematician and scientist. Renowned as one of the world's greatest ever mathematicians, he spent his entire life in the environs of Dublin.

His genius was apparent at an early age. By the age of five he had already learned Latin, Greek and Hebrew and at the age of thirteen he could speak thirteen languages. His pursuit of learning continued throughout his life.

Many events are scheduled throughout 2005 to honour this true Irish genius and this beautiful silver €10 coin is an elegant testament to his work. The coin, housed in a special presentation box, would make a wonderful gift or indeed a treasured memento of this special year.

On the national side of the coin Michael Guilfoyle, the designer, has paid tribute to Sir William Rowan Hamilton's use of algebraic equations which revolutionised mathematical physics. The gifted Irish scientist's understanding of symbols and mathematical language is represented by a decorative circular pattern formed from these symbols. At its centre is the Nabla, the symbolic operator introduced by Sir William to represent any arbitrary function. The symbol is so called because of its visual resemblance to the Egyptian harp of the same name.

This is the third silver €10 coin that Ireland has issued since the introduction of the Euro in 2002. It will be officially launched on 20 May 2005 in Trinity College, Dublin, home to the Hamilton Institute.

“Frank Hurley was hired by Earnest Shackleton to visually record the Antarctic Expedition of 1914-1917. This epic adventure of extraordinary courage in below zero conditions is so powerfully felt through Hurley’s photography, that featuring these images was an early decision in the stamp design process. Using the se-tenant format gave more scope in creating panoramic views of the icescapes, helped by the images running to the edge of the perforations. The stamps when broken into their individual units maintain a composition of their own, more evidence of Hurley’s skill as image maker. To heighten the sensation of Antarctic ice, tones of blue were applied to the photographs, which were originally taken in black and white. The views capture two aspects of the journey - the crew camping out and exercising the dogs during a hold-up.” - Ger Garland, Shackleton Stamp Designer
